

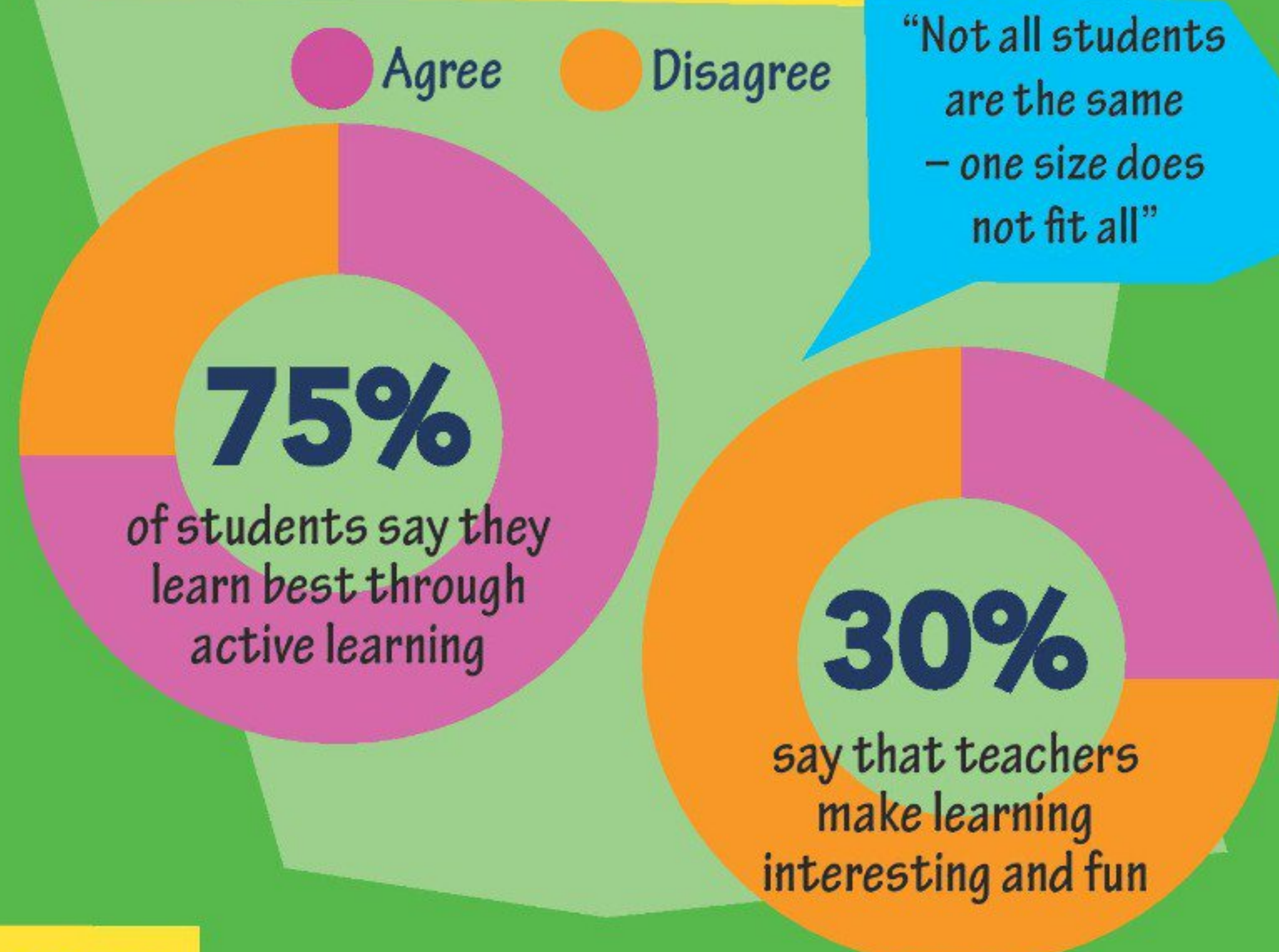
1. How young people experience teaching and learning in school

Less than **50%** of students learn best when they read textbooks

2. Feelings about school

"there should be less emphasis on exams. Students' progress should be individual and not compared to others"

3.3.1 Exams

64% of students wish there was more project work when it comes to exams

3.3.2 Stress

78% of exam students agree that exams are the biggest source of stress & young people think there is too much emphasis on exams

"More emphasis on a safe learning environment where students can actually give their opinions"

Less than half of students agree that students have a say in the classroom

3. Young people's views on services and facilities in school

3.4.1 Satisfaction with support services

Less than half of students are satisfied with the quality of counselling and mental health support

"Have a proper system for mental health and exam stress... the availability of a designated person to discuss and facilitate issues and discussion"

3.4.2 IT in school

66% of young people said IT helped them to learn

November 2014: Comhairle na nÓg Showcase

'Education and school' voted on as the area of young people's lives in which they least had a say. Becomes theme for Dáil na nÓg 2015.

November 2015: Dáil na nÓg

'What happens in the classroom' voted on as a priority issue to be worked on by the Comhairle na nÓg National Executive.

January 2016 – September 2017

Comhairle na nÓg National Executive developed a survey to explore how students are taught and how they learn in the classroom.

Background

'Comhairle na nÓg are local councils for children and young people aged 12-17 that give them a voice on youth issues. The Comhairle na nÓg National Executive is made up of one representative from each of the 31 Comhairle na nÓg. They work on the recommendations from Dáil na nÓg and make changes for young people in those areas.

Methodology

The Comhairle na nÓg National Executive developed this survey with help from the Department of Children and Youth Affairs, the Department of Education and Skills and a steering committee of education experts and researchers from the School of Education in University College Dublin (UCD).

3,242

young people took part in the survey at Comhairle na nÓg AGMs in October and November 2016.



43% were junior cycle students

57% were senior cycle students
